Dear Secretary Bose:

Public Utility District No. 1 of Snohomish County is notifying the Commission, per License Article 410 and related Fisheries and Habitat Monitoring Plan (Plan) Section 4.1 for the Jackson Hydroelectric Project, of its plans for monitoring activities in the Sultan River for the year 2019. The monitoring activities for 2019 will include:

- Riverine habitat monitoring per Plan Section 2.1, if there is a high flow event or other major event causing significant change,
- Water temperature monitoring per Plan Section 2.2,
- Spawner abundance, distribution and timing monitoring per Plan Section 3.1, and
- Juvenile production (smolt trap) monitoring per Plan Section 3.2 (Year 1 of 2 for 2018 to 2023 6-year block).
