Logo Usage Guidelines

The Snohomish County PUD Registered Trade Ally Logo is available for any commercial entity that has submitted appropriate documentation to Snohomish County PUD and been approved as a Registered Trade Ally. Upon notification of this status, the Registered Trade Ally can request an electronic version of the logo shown below. Approval for location and logo use is required for each instance. 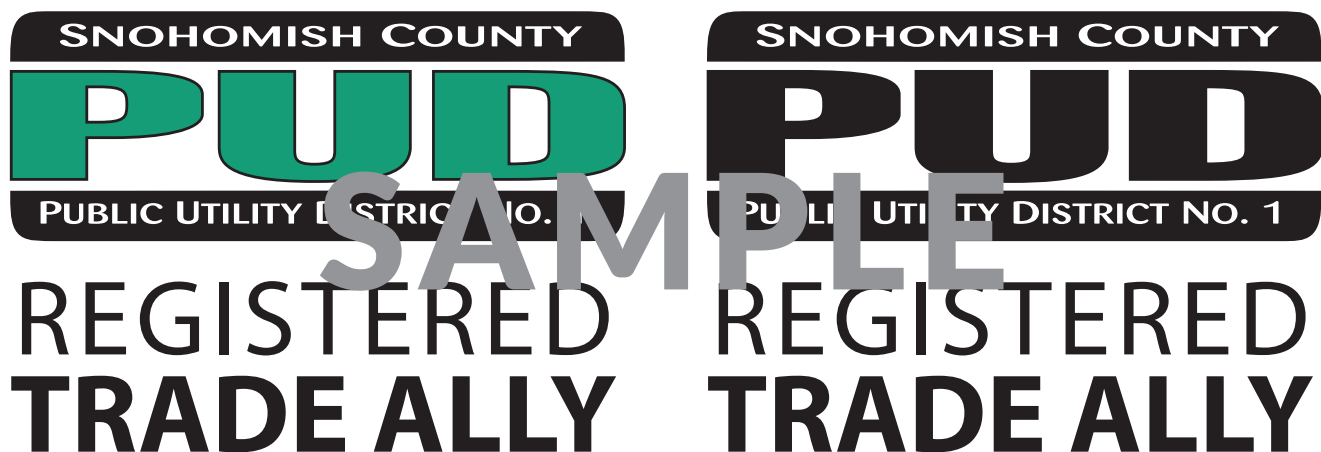
The Snohomish County PUD Registered Trade Ally logo must always:

- Be used horizontally with no rotation
- Be generated from artwork supplied by Snohomish County PUD
- Be freestanding on the background and never framed by an outline box
- Appear without distortion of the original aspect ratio. Don't stretch the logo to fit a specific space; if resizing, make certain the width and height are scaled proportionally.
- Appear unaltered (don't substitute fonts, redraw/redesign the logo or add taglines/text)
- Appear with space around it, uncluttered by other text, graphics, symbols, photos, etc., and should not be used as a background
- Be smaller than the Registered Trade Ally's own business logo

When used in print, the Snohomish County PUD Registered Trade Ally logo can be printed in one-color (all black), two-colors (black, Pantone® 340) or CMYK. The preferred background is white or a light color with no pattern. The logo can also be reversed to print on dark backgrounds.

When used on websites or other electronic media (e.g., PowerPoint, etc.), the Snohomish County PUD Registered Trade Ally logo should be the two-color version.
