TO: PUD Registered Trade Allies (Heating)

FROM: Snohomish PUD – Residential

RE: PROGRAM CHANGE

EFFECTIVE DATE: July 1, 2021

Snohomish PUD will be transitioning some of our Heating Rebates from a customer instant rebate to a Midstream Distributor rebate. Eligible equipment purchased through a participating Distributor will receive a rebate from the Distributor and PUD will reimburse the Distributor for each eligible unit sold. The participating Distributor does not need to be in Snohomish County to be eligible for the rebate.

Any Ductless Heat Pump, Heat Pump Upgrade or Non-Sized HP Conversion installed after **July 31, 2021** will <u>not</u> be eligible for a rebate, through PUD's Heating Program. Rather the rebate will be administered through the participating Distributor. <u>The Sized Heat Pump Conversion</u> <u>measures will continue under the current PUD submittal process and rebate structure.</u>

<u>Additionally</u>: We will be removing the Commissioning Controls and Sizing measure on July 1, 2021 from the Program, as well.

The Midstream program aligns with current offerings by Puget Sound Energy and Seattle City Light. Maintaining consistent offerings between Utilities reduces confusion in the marketplace, required paperwork and influences the stocking of high-efficiency products.

PUD benefits from economies of scale with an established infrastructure and existing market relationships. Residential customers, small and medium sized businesses and other underserved segments can benefit from the energy savings of high-efficiency equipment and products without the added burden of completing rebate applications and allows us to reach the emergency replacement market.
