PUD Breaks Ground on New North County Office in Arlington

onstruction recently began on our newest community office project. Our new North County Community Office will be located across the street from the Arlington Airport and will include a customer service lobby and publicly available conference and auditorium space. There will also be seven electric vehicle charging stations available for the public.

The new North County Community Office will replace the PUD's aging Arlington and Stanwood community offices, which were both built in the 1950s.

The North County Community Office will be connected to the PUD's Arlington Microgrid project, which was completed earlier this year. That connection will allow the Microgrid's solar array and battery storage to power the new office building and operations center during a storm or natural disaster that affects the overall grid.

Backup Power When You Need It Most

During storm season, outages can be part of life. This is especially true in more rural areas of our service territory. If you depend on electricity for life-saving medical equipment or you work from home, it might be wise to purchase a generator or larger battery packs.

A generator is a practical way to power parts of your home or business and can have electronics and appliances hooked up



directly to it or be integrated into your electrical panel through a transfer switch. It's important to remember to always have a professional electrician install a transfer switch and keep running generators outside at least 5 feet from any structure.
