HIGHLIGHTS OF PUD'S FIRST 10 YEARS ...

- * Residential sales of electricity increased 270 percent.
- ★ Revenues from the sale of electricity gained 148 percent.
- ★ Number of electric customers increased 52 percent.
- ★ Use of electricity in the average household jumped 143 percent.
- ★ Cost per kilowatt for residential use dropped 34 percent.
- * Revenue bonds refunded effecting a savings in interest of approximately \$5 million over the life of the bonds.
- ★ Over \$18,000,000 was invested in new plant entirely from electric revenues.
- ★ \$4,332,226 of taxes were paid by the District out of its income to support schools and local and state government.
- ★ Rate cuts made by the District have already saved the people more than \$2.5 million since 1955.
- ★ Liberalized line extension policy.
- * Residential street lighting throughout county modernized.
- ★ The District's substation capacity to meet current and future growth was increased 443 percent.
- ★ The District and City of Everett agreed to jointly develop the Sultan River for power and water.
