

UNION JOB DESCRIPTION

TITLE: Meter Journeyman

DEFINITION:

Under the direction of Metering Superintendent or designee, ensures the accuracy, reliability and integrity of the District's electrical energy metering and related equipment.

DISTINGUISHING CHARACTERISTICS:

The Meter Journeyman classification is distinguished from the Meterman Apprentice classification by the increased technical knowledge and skill required to perform the work. The Meterman Journeyman has successfully completed a certified Meterman Apprentice program.

BASIC RESPONSIBILITIES:

- 1. Installs, maintains, repairs, tests and calibrates all types of electrical energy metering and related equipment in the Meter Shop and on customers' premises.
- 2. Changes graphic charts on recording meters.
- 3. Tests and maintains high and low voltage personal protective safety equipment including but not limited too high and low voltage rubber gloves, blankets, and hot line tools.
- 4. Investigates complaints relating to the operation of the District's metering equipment.
- 5. Works with other District personnel, departments and government agencies in the investigation of power theft.
- 6. Disconnects and reconnects three-phase meters for customer service.
- 7. Troubleshoots and analyzes electrical problems as assigned on the District's electrical distribution systems, and on the customer's premise. Advises on possible solutions.

OTHER RESPONSIBILITIES:

- 1. Performs other related duties as assigned.
- 2. Performs duties of Meter Helper.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS:

These qualifications are those usually exhibited by a person with;

Knowledge of:

- District safety and WAC Electrical Workers Safety Rules.
- First Aid and CPR methods.
- Electrical service requirements for metering.
- Electrical energy metering installations.
- Low voltage secondary distribution systems.
- Basic electrical theory and high school level algebra.
- Customer Service techniques.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS: (continued)

Ability to:

- Analyze and resolve problems.
- Communicate and work effectively with all levels of the organization, other utilities and customers.
- Coordinate and direct work of others, including Meter Apprentices.
- Physically perform duties of the job.

Education/Experience:

- High School diploma or equivalent.
- Three (3) years experience working in the electric utility industry at the Journeyman Meterman level, satisfactorily complete an accredited Journeyman Meterman Apprenticeship.

License or Certification:

- Possess a valid Washington State Driver's license.
- Possess a valid First Aid certificate.
- Possess a valid CPR certificate.

WORKING CONDITIONS:

- Work is generally performed in the Meter Shop and in the field and in all types of weather conditions.
- Exposed to energized electrical wires and equipment.
- Lift and carry up to 50 lbs.
- Requires climbing ladders.
