1.0 INTRODUCTION

Public Utility District No. 1 of Snohomish County (Snohomish PUD) received a license on September 2, 2011 (License), from the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC) for the Henry M. Jackson Hydroelectric Project (Project). License Ordering Paragraphs D (Washington Department of Ecology 401 Water Quality Certification conditions) and E (U.S. Forest Service section 4(e) conditions) require Snohomish PUD to implement Aquatic License Article 12: Fish Habitat Enhancement Plan (A-LA 12) as detailed in License Appendix G. Snohomish PUD filed the Fish Habitat Enhancement Plan (FHE Plan) with the FERC on November 19, 2010.

As indicated in the FHE Plan, funded projects will be designed to provide additional Project-related enhancements to aquatic resources and hydrologic processes focused in the Sultan River basin; thereby, providing considerable benefits to aquatic habitat and anadromous and resident fish populations throughout the License term. These additional habitat enhancement projects, working in conjunction with other protection, mitigation, and enhancement measures, such as improved side channel connectivity, increased instream flows, and implementation of fish passage at the Diversion Dam, will likely substantially increase the quantity and quality of aquatic habitat and performance of anadromous and resident fish populations in the lower Sultan River. Establishment of the ongoing FHE Plan and Habitat Enhancement Account (HEA) will also allow for adaptive management as conditions in the basin change. The mitigation provided through the fund will best be able to address long-term habitat enhancement and restoration needs by allowing flexibility to ensure that projects are developed and implemented during the License term.

Pursuant to Section 6.2 of the FHE Plan, Snohomish PUD is to prepare a report by June 30 of each year detailing activities that occurred the previous year and activities planned for the present year as they relate to implementation of FHE Plan-approved projects. This FHE Plan Annual Report, covering activities conducted in 2023 and planned for 2024. Appendix 1 contains the new proposed projects for land conservation easement acquisition.

This draft report was provided to the Aquatic Resources Committee (ARC) for a 30-day review and comment period on May 24, 2024; no comments were received. The ARC consists of the City of Everett, City of Sultan, Snohomish County, Washington Department of Ecology, Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife, Tulalip Tribes, U.S. Forest Service, National Marine Fisheries Service, U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, and American Whitewater. Documentation of consultation with the ARC regarding the report is included in Appendix 2.

2.0 ACTIVITIES FOR YEAR 2023

2.1 Project Selection

At the end of June 2023, the ARC agreed to fund the pursuit of the Carlson property acquisition. No new projects were proposed at the October 2023 ARC meeting.

2.2 Project Implementation

2.2.1 Land Conservation Easement - Knowlton

On December 2, 2022, the ARC approved the pursuit of a land conservation easement acquisition with the Knowltons to support the side channel extension project pursuant to the WA Department of Ecology grant. A conservation easement was granted on January 25, 2023.

2.2.2 Land Conservation Easement - VOA

On May 16, 2023, the ARC approved the pursuit of a land conservation easement acquisition with the Volunteers of America to support the side channel extension project pursuant to the WA Department of Ecology grant. A conservation easement was granted on June 21, 2023.

2.2.3 Land Acquisition - Carlson

Snohomish PUD finalized the purchase of the property in December 2023.

2.3 Project Monitoring

No monitoring of FHE Plan habitat projects was conducted beyond that already described above.

3.0 ACTIVITIES FOR YEAR 2024

3.1 Project Selection

New projects can be proposed as part of the ARC meeting in October 2024. Projects needing immediate attention can be brought before the ARC at any time.

3.2 Project Implementation

3.2.1 Land Conservation Acquisition - Carlson

The mobile home, barn, accessory building, deck, horse fencing, and miscellaneous yard debris were removed from the property. A plan will be developed identifying potential additional restoration measures and presented to the ARC for discussion and approval of future activities.

3.3 Project Monitoring

Staff will conduct an annual inspection of the \sim 30-acre "Hochfeld" property to assess for trespass or vandalism.

4.0 FUND BALANCE

The HEA was seeded with \$2.5 million upon License issuance. Starting the tenth anniversary after issuance of the License (Year 11) and annually thereafter for the term of the License, Snohomish PUD deposits \$200,000 (based on 2011 dollars) into the fund account per Section 5.1 of the FHE Plan.

As of December 31, 2023, the fund's account balance was \$2,453,310.74. However, this balance does not reflect amounts not yet spent towards approved projects, debited from the fund, and

reserves for potential slides. The balance of unallocated funds for use on future projects is approximately \$1.56 million, as follows:

Project Information

Objectives

Acquire 2.83 acre parcel to remove prevent future development immediately adjacent to Sultan River and Trout Farm Creek, a tributary to the Sultan River. Remove existing structures and septic system and obtain any existing water right/claim associated with property. Remove interior fences, manage noxious weeds, and revegetate site. Address 33% passable fish passage barrier on Trout Farm Creek beneath existing driveway (see attached WDFW report). Allow riparian community to re-establish to the benefit of the Sultan River and Trout Farm Creek.

Description:

Rural Snohomish County is under constant development pressure. The Carlson property is being sold to settle an estate. The structures on the property are in rough shape so the property is not able to be financed through conventional financing. The value is in the land and the price point is high enough to limit the potential for a cash purchase. Therefore, this is a unique opportunity that warrants ARC consideration recognizing that a cash purchase from another party may occur.

Benefits:

Largely as stated in objectives presented above.

Methods:

District Natural Resources will work with its Real Estate and Environmental Affairs for due diligence acquisition and environmental review

Monitoring/Land Management:

Consistent with past practices and acquisitions under the FHE, 10% will be set aside for monitoring and management of site, as necessary.
