Public Utility District No. 1 of Snohomish County (Snohomish PUD) is notifying the Commission, per License Article 410 and related Fisheries and Habitat Monitoring Plan (Plan) Section 4.1 for the Jackson Hydroelectric Project, of its plans for monitoring activities in the Sultan River for the year 2026. The monitoring activities under License Article 410 for 2026 will include:

- Water temperature monitoring per Plan Section 2.2,
- Spawner abundance, distribution, and timing monitoring per Plan Section 3.1, and
- Juvenile production (smolt trap) monitoring per Plan Section 3.2 (Year 1 of 2 for 2024 to 2029 6-year block).
